Dear Delegate or Alternate,

Congratulations on your election as a delegate or alternate to the 2008 Washington State Democratic Convention. This will be an historic year for Democrats in Washington and across America as voters **Take Back Our Country**.

Included in this document are the proposed schedule, agenda and rules for the convention and information on the draft platform and proposed resolutions. These materials are the product of numerous hours of hard work by the Rules and Platform Committees. The efforts of the committee members in this process are greatly appreciated.

Becoming a Delegate or Alternate to the National Convention

Twenty-nine (29) delegates and four (4) alternates to the National Convention in Denver, CO will be elected at the State Convention on Sunday, June 15, 2008 beginning at 10:00 am. These individuals will be selected by the fifty-one (51) district-level delegates who were elected at the May 17th Congressional District Caucuses. This group of fifty-one (51) delegates constitute the Elections Committee. These twenty-nine (29) delegates and (4) alternates will consist of the following groups.

- Two Unpledged Add-on Delegates – Candidates nominated by the State Party Chair and elected by the full Elections Committee. Candidates **do not** need to submit declarations of candidacy.
- Ten (10) Party Leaders and Elected Officials (PLEOs) – Candidates are elected by their respective presidential preference sub-caucus of the Elections Committee. Candidates must submit a declaration of candidacy. A copy of this form properly completed and signed must be sent either by mail, fax or as a scanned pdf to the State Democratic Party headquarters and must be received no later than 5:00 pm Tuesday, June 10, 2008.
- Seventeen (17) At-large Delegates and (4) At-large Alternates - Candidates are elected by their respective presidential preference sub-caucus of the Elections Committee. Candidates must submit a declaration of candidacy. A copy of this form properly completed and signed must be sent either by mail, fax or as a scanned pdf to the State Democratic Party headquarters and must be received no later than 5:00 pm Tuesday, June 10, 2008.

The Democratic Party has a commitment to include historically underrepresented people in the party by virtue of race, ethnicity, age, sexual orientation or disability. We encourage full participation by all in the delegate selection process and in all party affairs.

Platform and Resolutions

The platform committee has developed a proposed platform and reviewed the numerous resolutions that were submitted through the caucus and convention cycle. In respect to the environment and in support of trees we have posted these items online for your review. You can find the draft platform and resolutions with a "do pass" recommendation on the State Democratic Party website (<http://www.wa-democrats.org/index.php?page=display&id=344>). Platform amendments or resolutions may still be submitted to the State Party prior to 12:00 pm (noon) on Tuesday, June 10, 2008 provided they are accompanied by the signatures of at least 50 (fifty) state convention delegates. This process is described in convention rule 16.

Charter Amendments

The State Party has also received 6 (six) proposed charter amendments. In continued support of our environmental efforts, the proposed amendments and a copy of the State Party Charter are located on the State Democratic Party website (<http://www.wa-democrats.org/index.php?page=display&id=344>). Delegates to the State Convention will vote on these proposals at the State Convention on Saturday, June 14, 2008.

Presidential Electors

Two Presidential Electors, one man and one woman, will be elected at the Convention. If you are interested in running for one of these positions you **do not** need to submit a declaration of candidacy to the State Party. Information on the process of electing Electors is described in convention rule 11. Information on the role of Electors is available on-line at <http://www.archives.gov/federal-register/electoral-college/>.

Nomination of Statewide Candidates

At the Convention delegates will be nominating candidates for state wide elected offices. This will be done in accordance with the standard rules for the Selection of Candidates and Nominees for Public Office adopted by the State Democratic Party in 2005.

Statewide Nominees. The nominees for all statewide partisan elected offices (US Senator, Governor, Lt. Governor, Secretary of State, Treasurer, Auditor, Attorney General, Insurance Commissioner, and Public Lands Commissioner) shall be selected at the Democratic State Convention. Such nominating conventions shall be called by the Chair of the Washington State Democratic Party not later than 14 days prior to the date filing for office commences. The results from each nominating convention shall be reported to the Chair of the Washington State Democratic Party within 24 hours after the convention has adjourned.

Proposed Rules

Proposed Rules from the Rules Committee in Accordance with WSDCC By-Laws

1). Call to Convention

The 2008 Washington State Democratic Convention shall be held on Saturday, June 14, 2008 in Spokane, Washington. The State Chair shall issue the Call for the Convention which shall be provided at least ten (10) days prior to the scheduled meeting to all delegates and alternates concerned. The total number of delegate positions is 2,000. The total number of alternate positions is 1,000.

2). Appointment of Convention Officials

The State Chair shall appoint the Temporary Chair of the Convention, the Permanent Chairs of the Rules, Credentials and Platform Committees, and the Secretaries, Parliamentarian, Sergeants-at-Arms, Timekeeper, and as many members of the Tally Committee as necessary.

3). Qualification of Delegates and Alternates

Each delegation shall be entitled to the number of delegates and alternates allocated to it by the State Committee. Delegates and alternates must be legal residents and registered voters of the County and Legislative District they were elected to represent. In the event that any delegate or alternate moves from the County or Legislative District he/she was elected to represent he/she shall automatically forfeit his/her seat and an alternate shall be seated in his/her place. In the event there is no alternate, the seat will be declared vacant.

4). Certification of Delegates and Alternates

Any delegate or alternate who has been properly certified by his/her respective County Chair or Legislative District Chair as being duly elected with the necessary number of votes shall be seated as a delegate or alternate. He/she shall vote and otherwise participate in the Convention until such time as any contest against him/her is sustained by the Credentials Committee or the Convention at large, provided that no person shall be permitted to vote on his/her own credentials contest.

5). Seating of Alternates

Alternates shall be seated in the order in which they were elected and must be of the same presidential preference, and, to the extent possible, of the same gender. A delegate may be replaced only by an alternate from his/her Legislative District. If a delegate is absent from a Legislative District containing more than one County, an alternate from the same County as the absent delegate shall be seated prior to any other alternate from the Legislative District.

6). Convention Committees

- A).** The Credentials, Rules and Platform Committees shall meet prior to the opening of the Convention. No person may cast more than one vote. The Co-Chairs of each committee shall vote only to break a tie. If after the Co-Chairs vote the result remains a tie, the measure shall fail.
- B).** The Convention Chair shall recognize the Co-Chairs of a committee to present the committee's report. The Co-Chairs may yield part of their time to others without losing their right to the floor.

7). Report of Credentials Committee

- A). The report of the Credentials Committee shall be acted upon before the consideration of any other business.
- B). After consideration and disposition of amendments, the Convention Chair shall put the question on the adoption of the Credentials Committee Report. Consideration of Convention business may proceed upon adoption of the Credentials Committee Report.

8). Amendment to Credentials Report

Unchallenged delegates, and alternates eligible to be seated, who arrive after the adoption of the Credentials Committee Report shall be seated by the Credentials Committee. Registration shall close at 12:00 pm (noon). Promptly thereafter, the Credentials Committee shall amend its report to include late arriving delegates.

9). Report of Rules Committee

- A). The report of the Rules Committee shall include a proposed agenda and rules and shall be provided to each delegate at least 10 days prior to the Convention.
- B). After consideration and disposition of amendments, the Convention Chair shall put the question on the adoption of the Rules Report.

10). Election of Permanent Chair

- A). Candidates for Permanent Chair of the Convention shall be nominated and seconded by at least 50 delegates to the Convention. Each candidate may use up to two (2) minutes on his or her own behalf for nominating and seconding speeches and a speech by the candidate. The two (2) minutes may be allocated at the candidate's discretion.
- B). A majority vote of the delegates present and voting shall be required to elect. If a majority is not achieved on the first vote, then the nomination list shall be reduced to the two receiving the highest totals and a succeeding vote shall be taken.
- C). The Permanent Chair shall take the gavel on announcement of the vote and shall preside until adjournment. It shall be the responsibility of the Chair to conduct and expedite the business of the Convention. He/she is authorized to appoint a person to temporarily perform the duties of the Chair in the absence of the Chair and to take such lawful action as may be necessary to preserve order throughout the Convention Hall.

11). Election of Presidential Electors

- A). Two (2) Presidential Electors shall be elected by the State Convention delegates. One man and one woman shall be elected. Two (2) alternates, one man and one woman, shall be elected by the State Convention delegates to serve in place of the Electors if necessary.
- B). All candidates for Presidential Electors must be nominated and seconded by delegates to the Convention and must be resident, registered voters of the state. They need not be identified as to Presidential preference or uncommitted status. A candidate need not be present to be elected but if not present must have filed a letter of intent with the State Chair prior to the Convention. A second is required.
- C). Each candidate may use up to one (1) minute total for nominating, seconding, and/or a candidate speech, to include the time spent by the Chair in reading the letter for a candidate not in attendance. The one (1) minute may be allocated at the candidate's discretion.
- D). After nominations are completed, voting shall be by signed ballot with all positions filled. Delegates will vote for one man and one woman. Any candidate for Elector who receives a majority of the valid ballots cast on the first ballot shall be eligible for election. If either of the available Elector positions have not been filled after the first ballot a second ballot shall be held between the next two highest voter getters of the appropriate gender for each position remaining in the field (if there is one position remaining there will be two candidates, if there are two positions four candidates.) Ties will be decided by lot.
- E). The alternate shall be the next highest vote getter of the appropriate gender after the election of the Electors.

12). Tally Periods

At the discretion of the chair, consideration of the platform and resolutions may take place during tally periods without suspension of the rules.

13). Ties Decided by Lot

In all voting for Permanent Chair or Presidential Electors ties shall be broken by lot.

14). Nominating Conventions

Rules for the Nominating Convention shall be the standard rules for the Selection of Candidates and Nominees for Public Office adopted by the State Democratic Party. Candidates for statewide office shall be given fifteen (15) minutes for nomination speeches and demonstrations.

15). Report of Platform Committee

- A). The report of the Platform Committee shall be provided to each delegate and alternate at least ten (10) days prior to the Convention. The draft platform and resolutions shall be available for comment on the State Democratic Party website (<http://www.wa-democrats.org>) from May 20th – 30th. Platform Committee members may hold hearings in their Counties or Legislative Districts or receive comments directly or indirectly through the State Party's website.
- B). The Platform Committee shall meet on May 10th, 11th, 18th, 31st and June 13th.

16). Submission of Proposed Platform Amendments and Resolutions

- A). A proposed platform amendment or resolution must be submitted electronically in Microsoft Word. It must be signed by at least fifteen (15) delegates, no more than ten (10) of whom come from both the same County and the same Legislative District, or by any twenty five (25) delegates (electronic signatures are not allowed); and submitted by 5:00 pm on Wednesday May 28, 2008. A hard copy of the amendment or resolution with required signatures shall be presented in the office of the Washington State Democratic Party located at 615 – 2nd Ave., Suite #580, Seattle, WA 98104, received by mail at PO Box 4027, Seattle, 98194 or faxed to (206) 583-0301 by the same deadline.
- B). A proposed amendment or resolution presented after the deadline in the preceding paragraph (**16.A.**) must be submitted electronically in Microsoft Word. It must be signed by at least 50 (fifty) delegates (electronic signatures are not allowed); and submitted by 12:00 pm (noon) on Tuesday, June 10, 2008. A hard copy of the amendment or resolution with required signatures shall be presented in the office of the Washington State Democratic Party located at 615 – 2nd Ave., Suite #580, Seattle, WA 98104, received by mail at PO Box 4027, Seattle, 98194 or faxed to (206) 583-0301 by the same deadline.
- C). The Platform Committee will determine whether an amendment or resolution meets the test of a platform amendment, resolution or neither. If such a determination is challenged, the Platform Committee Co-Chair shall explain the determination and the challenge shall otherwise be non-debatable.

17). Adoption of Platform

- A). The Convention shall adopt a platform that spells out the basic values and core beliefs of Washington Democrats.
- B). The proposed platform shall be presented by the Platform Committee.
- C). A motion for adoption of the platform as presented will be placed on the floor by the Platform Committee. The Convention chair will entertain motions for debate. Amendments to delete platform language and make grammatical corrections shall be accepted from the floor with fifty (50) seconds. Amendments to add language will not be in order.

18). Adoption of Resolutions

- A). Resolutions shall be consistent with the platform. They shall address specific or transitory issues, include actionable language and be submitted in the required format as publicized on the State Democratic Party's website (<http://www.wa-democrats.org>).
- B). Resolutions shall be considered by the Convention following final consideration of the platform. Resolutions shall be grouped by related Platform topics. Within each topic, the resolutions (if any) proposed by the Platform Committee shall be considered first, followed by resolutions submitted in compliance with paragraph **16.A.** followed by **16.B.** above. They shall be considered in the order in which they were received.
- C). The Platform Committee shall consider all resolutions submitted and may make a recommendation on each of DO PASS, DO NOT PASS, or CONSOLIDATE. Amendments and resolutions which are consolidated by the Platform Committee shall be presented as consolidated. No amendments to the resolutions will be accepted from the floor.
- D). Resolutions not acted upon at the Convention shall be referred to the State Central Committee for Action.

19). Rules for Debate

Debate on any question before the Convention not otherwise covered in these rules shall be limited in the following manner:

- A). Only delegates and alternates seated in place of absent delegates have voice and vote from the floor of the Convention.
- B). Each speaker shall be limited to two (2) minutes.
- C). No more than two (2) speakers on each side of the question shall be recognized by the Chair.
- D). Commencing at 3:00 p.m. or upon adoption of the platform, whichever event occurs later, debate shall be limited to one (1) speaker on each side of the question for one (1) minute each.
- E). Motions to table and to postpone indefinitely shall not be entertained.
- F). Any fifty (50) delegates may demand a division of the body.

20). Quorum

A quorum shall consist of 40% of the delegates seated upon the report of the Credentials Committee, as amended. A quorum call shall not be entertained prior to 4:00 p.m., but in no event prior to the election of Presidential Electors and Alternates and before at least one hour has been devoted to the consideration of resolutions. Thereafter, in the event of a quorum call, the Chair shall ascertain the presence or absence of a quorum by visual estimate or roll call of the delegations. The Chair shall not proceed unless a quorum is present, provided that (a) a motion to adopt the full platform without further amendment or debate, or (b) a motion to adjourn, may be considered without a quorum present.

21). Activity on the Convention Floor

Floor demonstrations shall not be permitted except for candidates for President of the United States and during the nominating conventions. Special credentials will be issued in quantities established by the Convention Sergeant at Arms to allow access to staging area for these campaigns to prepare their floor demonstrations, and access to the floor only for the time of the demonstration. Upon completion of the demonstration these credentials shall be returned to the Sergeant at Arms.

22). Speakers at the Convention

The Chair of the Convention, at his or her sole discretion, may recognize candidates and other persons to address the Convention up to 5 minutes (maximum).

23). No Endorsements

The Convention shall not endorse candidates or initiatives.

24). Robert's Rules

In other matters not specifically covered herein, Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, shall prevail.

Statement on the Supreme Court Decision From Dwight Pelz, Chair Washington State Democratic Party

March 20, 2008

On March 18, 2008 the United State Supreme Court issued an opinion reversing the summary judgment of the United States District Court in Seattle which had held that I-872 was unconstitutional on its face. The Supreme Court opinion does not hold that I-872 is constitutional. Rather it holds that until the State actually implements the top two primary and provides a ballot design for use under the initiative the question of constitutionality cannot be determined. That is, the Initiative is still vulnerable to "as applied" challenges.

Five of the Supreme Court Justices indicated in their opinion that if the implementation of I-872 creates a risk of widespread voter confusion about whether candidates stating a Democratic preference are in fact the Democratic nominees then the Initiative would be subject to strict scrutiny and thus would almost certainly be unconstitutional. Two of the other Supreme Court Justices indicated that I-872 would be subject to strict scrutiny unless the State implements I-872 in such a manner that "no reasonable person" could be confused about whether a person stating a Democratic preference is a member of, approved by or a candidate of the Democratic Party. The remaining two Justices simply stated flat out that it was impossible to implement I-872 in a constitutional manner.

The Supreme Court also reaffirmed our right to nominate our candidates by whatever process we choose since I-872 removed the requirement that we nominate candidates in a public primary. The Court confirmed, however, that under I-872 there will be no designation on the ballot as to which candidate is our nominee; only an indication as to which party a candidate personally prefers. It remains to be seen whether the form of that preference statement will cause confusion when actually used on ballots. That is one of the "as applied" issues still to be decided by the courts.

Our challenge to the Initiative is still pending in Court. In its 2005 opinion the District Court in Seattle expressly reserved for further proceedings any "as applied" challenges related to the actual implementation of the Initiative.

Because the State no longer requires us to select our candidates in an unconstitutional blanket primary and has indicated that it will not conduct in 2008 the "Montana" style primary that has been in use for the past three years, party organizations should plan on nominating candidates pursuant to the rules adopted by the Washington State Democratic Central Committee in April 2005. These rules generally provide that PCOs will vote on nominations at meetings held prior to May 23, 2008. The nominating process is separate from the current process of selecting delegates for the state and national conventions.
